

Jesus Christ Is Our Champion Against the Devil

Deuteronomy 26:1-11 ~ Romans 10:8b-13~ Luke 4:1-13

Jesus Christ, our champion against the devil, endures and overcomes "every temptation" (Luke 4:13) on our behalf. He worships the Lord, His God, and serves Him only by trusting the Word of His Father: "You are my beloved Son; with you I am well pleased" (Luke 3:22). Jesus' victory is now ours through His gracious Word, which is not far away but near us — in our mouth and in our heart, in the proclamation of repentance and faith. For "with the heart one believes and is justified, and with the mouth one confesses and is saved" (Rom. 10:10). Our confession of Christ includes the prayer of faith, which is not disappointed, "for 'everyone who calls on the name of the Lord will be saved'" (Rom. 10:13). The Lord is not oblivious to "our affliction, our toil, and our oppression" (Deut. 26:7), but has mercy upon us. He has brought us out of bondage through the "signs and wonders" of Holy Baptism, "with a mighty hand and an outstretched arm" (Deut. 26:8), and now He leads us by His Spirit even in the wilderness.

OLD TESTAMENT LESSON

Deuteronomy 26:1-11

"When you come into the land the LORD your God is giving you as your own and you take it and settle there, take some of the first of everything the soil produces that you gather from the land the LORD your God is giving you and put it in a basket, then go to the place where the LORD your God chooses to put His name. Go to the man who is the priest at that time, and tell him, 'I declare today to the LORD your God that I have come into the land the LORD swore to our fathers to give us.' Then the priest should take the basket from your hand and set it down in front of the altar of the LORD your God. And you should declare before the LORD your God: 'My father was a wandering Aramean. He went down to Egypt, being only a few, and stayed there as a stranger.

But there he became a great nation, mighty and large. But the Egyptians mistreated us, made us suffer and work hard for them. We cried to the LORD, the God of our fathers, and the LORD heard us: He saw how we were suffering, toiling, and being oppressed, and the LORD brought us out of Egypt with a mighty hand and an outstretched arm, with great terrors, with signs and wonders. He brought us to this place and gave us this land, a land flowing with milk and honey. And now I bring the firstfruits of the ground You gave me, LORD.' Set it down before the LORD your God, and worship the LORD your God. Then you, your family, the Levite, and the stranger living among you should delight in all the good things the LORD your God has given you.
